#### Anti-social behaviour (ASB)

We are pleased to say that over the Christmas and New Year period there were fewer calls reporting ASB in the village of Sonning Common. The neighborhood team have taken steps to prevent and deter these issues and will continue to monitor the situation with regular patrols of the area.

Please make sure that your vehicle is secure and that there are no valuables on display (remove them if possible). Make sure you set your car alarm and park in busy well-lit areas. If you have a work's van then please make sure you remove your tools if possible and make sure they are security marked. #### What the neighbourhood team have been doing

There has been an increase in rural crime on our area with theft of Land Rovers and theft from outbuildings. Henley Neighbourhood team continue to work with gamekeepers and land owners suggesting options for target hardening. We continue to conduct dedicated day and night time operations targeting rural crime.

The team were involved in the collection of Christmas food donations at local shops. They were then put in a hamper and distributed to the elderly and vulnerable in our area. The donations were gratefully received with thanks for the generosity of members of the public.
