Chair's Report

Apolitical/Elected/9 Councillors (SODC/OCC)

Represents the interests of the "smaller villages" which make up Shiplake Parish

Approximately 1300 electors

Popn 1955 – 635 households 20% in Shiplake X 80% in LS

Day to day activities managing assets and responding to planning applications and to lobby on issues impacting our community.

Monthly meetings and some sub-committee meetings

Finance Report Year End 31st March 2017

Income £35492 Spend £63706

Remaining reserves £50586

One-off expenditure (anticipated) – fighting fund for Thames Farm (c.£27k) and Shiplake Plan (c.£13k)

We try and allocate our reserves to future projects and so anticipate events and potential overspend.

Finance Report

Maintained our strong commitment to the school, local charities, clubs and the Memorial Hall.

Any local charities need help?

Any community events need supporting?

Funds are available to benefit the community.

Council tax reduction for the PC -53p (£28.15 pa)

We remain one of the cheapest Parishes per capita!

Planning Report

- C.48 applications reviewed by Planning Committee (68 last year). A big reduction!?
- 37 no strong views; 11 initial parish objections ie 23% (16%). Of these:
- 4 became no strong views following amendment
- 3 were approved by SODC Planning Committee against our recommendation;
- 2 refused at Planning Committee
- 1 amended and awaiting decision; 1 undecided at Planning Committee.

A very good track record – we fight very hard on each application that we feel should be refused.

Planning protection has deteriorated.

Planning The Current state of play

SODC now claim a 5.4 year housing supply

The Local Plan is currently being updated.

Developers have been swooping on non-NP areas.

Government pressure to build houses.

House and land prices in Shiplake high and higher returns for developers.

Tendency for houses to get bigger via extensions or new builds.

The PC believes a NDP is essential

We continue to challenge SODC leadership and want more control over our own affairs.

We have a strong relationship with 5 other local parishes

Retirement Village and Wyevale

Retirement Village:

4 day Inquiry at Henley Rugby Club starts 11th September.

A strong defence is being built which will use external expertise where necessary.

A good showing at the Inquiry on all days is highly valuable particularly at the start and finish — more details nearer the time -

Wyevale:

The PC remain unanimously opposed to this application:

Concerns re loss of commercial/employment site – question mark over marketing and financial analysis – recent commercial site in JHHNP.

The Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council were unanimous in wishing to develop a NP

It's not just about housing but it's about creating a vision for the villages for the future.

We are very impressed with the work and commitment of the team

We will do whatever is necessary to support the initiatives that the residents of Shiplake see as the priority for the future.

We also need to protect the environment, build on the strong sense of community, support our businesses and create a vibrant, supportive place to live.


